8)	5G AND SMALL CELLS: THE PUBLIC SAFETY NETWORK IMPACT (Information Item): At the October 11, 2018, Board meeting, the Board requested a briefing on 5G and small cells. Mr. Ken Rehbehn, Principal Analyst at Critical Communications Insights, will present on potential public safety impacts of 5G and small cells. With the publication of the FCC's Declaratory Ruling and Third Report and Order on the matter of "Accelerating Wireless Broadband Deployment by Removing Barriers to Infrastructure Investment", the Commission restricted local government discretion over small cell deployments in communities. This briefing
	provides a high-level examination of small cell and 5G technology characteristics. Mr. Rehbehn will also review the Report and Order and discuss the relationship between the new siting rules, small cells, 5G technology and public safety communications requirements.
